- Thousands of electronic full-text journals are available to WSU faculty, staff, and students. To see (or search) the WSU Libraries' complete list of electronic journals, visit the Article Indexes / E-Journals page and select "Electronic Journals Search and A-Z list."

Examples of online, full text journals include JAVMA, JAAHA, Journal of Equine Veterinary Science, Veterinary Surgery, the Veterinary Clinics of North America (all sections), etc.

Print Journals: Bound journals are located alphabetically by title on top and lower floors of the Library. Unbound issues are alphabetically by title upstairs on open display shelves.

- To see a list of WSU's veterinary-related databases, click the "Databases by Subject" link, and choose "Veterinary Medicine" from the subject list. Then click on "Go".
- You may also select a database by clicking Databases A-Z and entering the name, e.g. CAB.
Important: Use the  links to connect to full text articles, Griffin, and/or ILLiad (interlibrary loan) in these databases.
- **VetMed Resource** (CAB Abstracts and more)— 1910-present (veterinary references go back to 1931) Includes references and abstracts from hundreds of veterinary journals, conference proceedings, and books, including some full text. International coverage. Updated weekly.
Also includes *Animal Health and Production Compendium*, an interactive multimedia encyclopedia covering livestock and poultry. VetMed Resource's CAB Direct is the most comprehensive source of references from clinical veterinary journals and books.
Includes references and abstracts from hundreds of veterinary journals and books. Updated weekly. This is the most comprehensive sources of references from veterinary journals and books. Some full text included, as well as  links.
- **PubMed** (1950-):
Contains references with abstracts to articles in over 4,600 biomedical journals covering all aspects of medicine. Includes indexing to 100+ veterinary journals. Updated daily. There are 3 viewing stations in the Library. Board Flash Cards are located behind the Circ Desk. Other printed Board books are located in the Reserve collection (SF759 area)

Bound volumes of **Senior Papers—1967-2009** are located on low shelves to the left of the security gate as you enter the library. Also they online on the CVM web site (Classes of 2003-2009)

Getting materials:

Journals: If not available electronically (check A-Z E-Journal list or use the FindIt@WSU button), select **Article Reach. Interlibrary Loan, then Pullman.** If this is your first time using ILLiad you will be asked to register- just sign in and follow the instructions.

Books: If at WSU, use **Request Item** from Griffin. If not, search **WSU WorldCat** (SUMMIT) and follow directions for ordering.

Creativity Stations: 3 computer work stations, located in the current journals area, complete with MS Office products, scanners, CD readers and burners, and networked to black-and-white printer.

Access to the CVM Network from the Animal Health Library (3) - the end workstation in the Creativity Station area, one in the Group Study Room, and one in public computer area.

Library printer: Black and white. Uses Cougar Cards only, 10 cents per page.

Scanners: As a printing/copying alternate, scan articles and papers to your H: drive (must use CVM Creativity Station computer), download to a thumb drive, or send to your email.

Wireless access: Available from most areas of the Animal Health Library.

Ethernet ports: Available in the current journal area behind the Group Study Room.

Free Services Available to Veterinarians: <http://www.wsulibs.wsu.edu/ahl/forvets.htm>

- **MEDLINE via PubMed (1950s--):** <http://www.pubmed.gov> - Same database used by WSU users, but contains links to ONLY free full-text articles.
- **Agricola:** <http://agricola.nal.usda.gov/> - Primarily an agricultural index. Not as complete as CAB Abstracts or PubMed for veterinary medicine. Coverage better for large animals than small.
- **Consultant:** <http://www.vet.cornell.edu/consultant/consult.asp> - Primarily a diagnostic database, but also contains selected current references to veterinary articles. Searchable by sign or diagnosis.
- **Veterinary Conference Proceedings:** <http://www.medvet.umontreal.ca/biblio/rech.htm> - A searchable index to various veterinary conference proceedings.
